Fluoride varnish can help prevent cavities

Q What is fluoride varnish?

A It is a resin (tree sap) based fluoride gel. Studies show it can reduce decay in children by 40 to 56%.

Q How can fluoride varnish help my child's teeth?

A Fluoride varnish helps prevent cavities by making tooth enamel stronger. If your child has the beginning stage of decay (white spots), fluoride varnish can help stop those spots from becoming cavities.

Q How is fluoride varnish applied?

A The child is held in the laps of the parent and the dental professional. A small brush is used to "paint" the varnish on the teeth. A special office setting is not needed.

Q *Is fluoride varnish safe?*

A Yes, fluoride varnish is safe. The use of fluoride varnish is approved and recommended by Health Canada and The Canadian Dental Association.

Q Are there any reasons my child should not have fluoride varnish?

A Please let your dental health professional know if your child has any allergies or medical conditions.
